

# **Inspiring Visit from Will Goodge**

On Thursday we were lucky enough to have an assembly where we were joined by Will Goodge, a former pupil of The Firs. Will shared with the children, his incredible journey running from John O Groats to Lands End in just 16 days to raise money for charity. This involved Will in running from 38 to 79 miles a day. Over that time Will's focus was to raise money for 'Save The Children', which is a charity his late mother supported.

Will talked to the children about the equipment he used, the amount of food he had to eat over the day, the transit van where he cooked and slept and stressed the key role played by the team of adults who supported / joined in with him on his epic journey. The children found Will's journey fascinating which was evident in the quantity and quality of questions asked by the children afterwards. One child said at the end of the assembly "I liked him, he was really nice and when I am older I want to be like him and do what he does to raise money".
