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Free School Meals and FSM Vouchers



We have received some questions regarding this and I thought it might be helpful to set out the Government position in updated guidance 31/3/20:

'It is right that schools concentrate their effort and resources on those who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals at this time. There is no requirement to continue universal infant free school meals to pupils in YR, Y1 or Y2, who are unable to attend school' (as they have not been identified as 'vulnerable' or children of key worker parents).

We have been in touch with Parents/Carers of children who have 'benefit related' free school meals, regarding how the school will be ensuring an alternative to the usual school meal provision. The government has now launched its voucher scheme and we will be getting in touch with the parents/carers concerned to let them know how this will operate.

Repayments for Trips and the Residential visit

We are pleased to say that repayments for trips and the Grafham residential are now underway and parents/carers should start to see reimbursements into their accounts in the next few days. Thank you for your patience and understanding in regard to this matter.
