



#### **Transition Work For Year 4**

We are very conscious of the need to try to address the transition needs of Year 4 pupils, despite the challenging circumstances. We are keeping in close contact with the other FARM schools and I can pass on that Alameda is currently working on a transition flow chart, with the dates for transition events and we are hoping that we will be able to pass this onto Y4 parents and children, either tomorrow or early next week.

#### Virtual Lessons Online

Some parents have asked whether we will be switching to delivering all or some of our Home Learning to a 'virtual lesson format'.

We have reservations about the suitability of live online lesson delivery to large groups of young children at home. In addition, the considerable amount of time it would take to prepare and deliver such lessons would be difficult to manage in relation to all the other tasks the school is involved in, including the immense amount of preparatory work for the return to school of certain year groups, that is discussed below.

We are trying to include appropriate online content in the home learning packs we are sending home and we are making a great effort to ensure that the home learning material is as varied and accessible as possible.

#### **Future Developments**

You will no doubt be aware that the Government has announced that schools plan to reopen in some form from 1<sup>st</sup> June for preschool, reception, Year 1 and Year 6 pupils **if the government thinks it is safe at that time**.

With this week's 'Keeping In Touch' you will also find another letter about the changes we are currently planning for from the 1st June. We have been liaising closely with the other FARM schools, sharing our thinking and discussing the formulation of common approaches and will write to you next week with more details.
