Saplings, Year 1 and Pine - Returning to school next week

I wrote to Saplings parents on Wednesday informing them about the final few details regarding the way we are organising the return of the older Saplings children to school from the 15th.

Today all parents of Year R and Year 1 children will receive a letter that gives the final details needed, such as which group children are in and when they need to be dropped off etc.

The letter is accompanied by a presentation that we have made for each group. We want every child to come back into school with a smile on their face, but we realise school will look different, they may be with different staff and we want to help with any anxiety or uncertainty they are feeling.




A title page from one of the presentations we

I am very aware that, in following the Government plan we are needing to focus on the return of some of our children and I have said before that we haven't forgotten the children who sadly, cannot be with us right now.

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Welcome Back to Saplings, Purple and Red Group

I know that the recent announcement from the Government, regarding abandoning the plan to return all children before the end of the term, will have been a huge disappointment to many, especially perhaps in Year 4.

I also know that some people will be relieved because there is considerable and understandable concern about safety and worries about sending children into school. We respect both 'views' on what is obviously becoming an important national debate.

We are missing all our children terribly and I think we would all just like the chance to return to some form of 'normality' if we could.

We are currently having meetings to look at the way forward and to explore anything we can do to get any / all Y2, Y3 and Y4 children back into school for even a very short visit. We know that this is particularly an issue for Y4 given that this is their last year with us.

The difficulty we have however is that all our staff and nearly every classroom sized space in school is currently being used to implement the return to school for the older Saplings, Year R and Year 1 children. We also have a complex Risk Assessment and associated procedures





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we need to follow, such as reducing the movement between different 'bubbles' of staff and children and so this is a very complex and difficult issue.

Please be assured that we will do everything we can to get children back briefly, to see us and each other and we will prioritise providing the Y4 children with a short goodbye/transition event.

We are aiming to give you an important update on our plans this term in the next Keeping In Touch Letter, at the end of next week.

Thank you for your ongoing patience, understanding and support, which means a great deal to us in these difficult and stressful times.

Key worker Provision

We are under increasing pressure regarding requests for additional Y2, Y3 and Y4 key worker places. This is very understandable given the fact that people are returning to work increasingly. The difficulty we have is that we cannot have groups bigger than 15 and all our staff are now needed to run the existing KW group and the new groups coming in from next week.

All FARM (Firs, Alameda, Russell, Maulden) schools are experiencing these difficulties and we are liaising with the LA about the problem.

We would like to remind all current Key Worker provision parents and parents considering applying for places that they *must only consider using/applying for any time in school* if there is *absolutely no other child care available*.
