

Update on Reopening The Firs

We are so looking forward to welcoming all our children back to school next week and as the 8th March draws closer, we are very busy preparing for the day! RWI 1 to 1 Tuition

We wanted to take this opportunity to congratulate our children who have been having their 1 to 1 RWI tuition sessions remotely recently. They have all worked very hard and we are very proud of them! A big thank you to Mrs Mercer for organising this and to Mrs Lacey and Mrs Eddy for delivering the sessions, which was a new experience for them too!

Chromebooks

We wanted to take this chance to let everyone know that we have managed to secure 10 laptops from the DfE and 6 from the local charity effort mentioned in our newsletter before half term. We have managed to send home 18 chromebooks and a wireless hub, to help with internet access.

This has had a really important impact on making sure all our children can access remote learning. I would like to say thank you to all the support from parents/carers for setting up and supporting children using the equipment and a very big thank you to Ellen Ashby, our ICT Administrator, for organising this project.

Teaching Assistant Vacancy - Fixed Term

As part of our Covid 19 recovery - Additional Support Programme, we have a teaching assistant vacancy to work as soon as possible, working Monday - Friday afternoon from 1.20 - 3.20pm supporting children with their learning. Firs Remote Learning Survey

We were very grateful for 112 parents who contributed to our survey on remote learning and for the overwhelmingly positive feedback we received. It was also very useful to have some suggestions to improve and enhance what we were doing, in the best interests of all the children, such as expanding the very popular use of 'Community Time' in KS1 and ensuring French was included in KS2.

We were very pleased to hear that parents valued the support being offered by teachers through emails, calls and conversations on Google Classroom and that the majority of parents liked the mix of approaches:

- 'I think the mix of live, recordings and tasks set is working well, and is well structured, we know when to expect the work each day and feedback is received quickly, which is important for the children.'
- 'I have been overwhelmed by the support and assistance offered'.

It also came over strongly, that the Community Time sessions were of great benefit in supporting children's well being and helping them to feel connected as a group, with their teacher and importantly, with each other.

• '--- absolutely loves seeing his classmates twice a week'.

We realise that learning at home is not easy for many children and we were not surprised by the 15% of responses that expressed concerns regarding progress. We will be continuing to follow the additional support programme, begun in the autumn, to focus on helping children to revise missed objectives and bridge gaps in learning, as soon as children rejoin us from 8th March.
