Safety on the service road

We have been concerned over the last couple of weeks about the numbers of Alameda and Firs parents/carers using the school access road to drop off / pick up children. The service road should only be used by parents / carers for Kids' Club and The Saplings.

With the return of all our children from Monday 8th, there will be a much larger number of people using the site and so, in order to re-establish appropriate access to the site and to ensure safety, we will be working with Alameda Middle School to 'cone off' the entrance to the service road, to ensure only authorised traffic uses the road. Thank you in advance for your support.

Reading at home

Once the children return to school, we will assess all the children who were on the RWI programme at the end of the autumn term. We will work through these assessments as quickly as we can but it will take a couple of weeks to complete this process.

In the meantime, we want to get children reading at home again next week, so please can your child continue to take home books from the same colour band they were on before Christmas. Please refer to the colour sticker on the front of your child's Reading Record/ Fish Book if you are unsure.

Your child's class teacher will be able to share the results of the RWI assessment with you at the forthcoming Parent/Teacher consultation meeting and let you know your child's reading colour band.

Reading Book Stations

Reading books will be available to change next week, *starting with Pine on Monday 8th*, just as we set out in the letter we sent home last Friday. The arrangements will be as follows:

- a. Y1 books will be on the table on the station road side of the netting on
- b. Y2 books will be on a table in the area outside the main doors.
- c. Y1 and Y2 books will be put out on *Tuesday and Friday*
- d. Pine will use the same station as Y2 on *Monday and Thursday*.
- e. Y3 and Y4 children will need to change their books themselves from class boxes and this will be administered by the class teacher.
