Read, Write, Inc. eBooks for Y2 children

We are very excited to announce that Oxford Owl has recently released a collection of RWI eBooks. This is a fantastic resource which we really hope your child will take advantage of at home. It is specifically aimed at children who are on the RWI programme. At the moment, we have set up logins for the Y2 children and after Easter, we will roll this out to other children. A letter will be coming home with the Y2 children today, which will include instructions about how to access this resource and your child's login details. As a school, we are very passionate about reading and your support with this is much appreciated.

Contact Tracing Over Easter

Schools are asked to remain contactable so they can assist with contact tracing where necessary. This will allow enough time for positive coronavirus (COVID-19) cases to be identified and confirmed by a test and for relevant contacts in the education setting to be traced. Schools have been asked to ensure staff, parents and carers are aware of the following:

- If a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.
- Parents/carers should contact us if a child who attends The Firs tests positive after developing symptoms within 48 hours of the end of term. For most, this would mean developing symptoms up to approximately 3:30pm on 28th March 2021.
- Parents/carers should email us at <u>office@firslower.org</u> giving details of when symptoms developed, when the child was tested and a contact number in case we need to get in touch. This email will be monitored daily between **9am and 10am until 1st April 2021**
- If any positive cases are reported, we will then inform all those we believe to be close contacts, which in most cases will be the class bubble.
- All close contacts will then need to self-isolate for 10 days from the day they last had contact with
 the infected person. The guidance goes on to clarify: 'Where a pupil or staff member tests positive
 for coronavirus (COVID19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school,
 the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions
 provided by NHS Test and Trace.'

With this newsletter there is an update sheet from Central Bedfordshire, that all schools are being asked to pass onto parents. It gives an overview of testing for both children and young people, wider household members, as well as the testing expectation over the Easter holidays. Could this information please be disseminated to parents and carers prior to the end of term.

PTA Easter Egg Raffle

The winners of the PTA Easter Egg raffle were announced today in our virtual assembly and the children were very excited to find who the winners were.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the PTA for all their hard work and for the efforts they put in to provide exciting and enjoyable experiences for the children and for raising much needed funds for the school.

The school is planning how we will respond if the expected loosening of Covid 19 restrictions occurs as set out in the schedule in the Government roadmap and we will of course keep parents/carers informed prior to any changes.

I can confirm that all arrangements, including the wearing of masks, drop off and pick up times and keeping all meetings virtual etc. will continue as they are currently after the Easter break. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all our parents/carers for their support with all the aspects of our Coronavirus measures, as your support is greatly appreciated.
