

July's invoices for Wraparound care have already been applied to ParentPay to allow for payments to be made by 22nd July 2019. If paying by childcare vouchers, please keep in mind that these can take up to 5 days to be received by us, so please action your payment by the start of the week beginning 19th July, to allow for time for the funds to be cleared into our accounts.

Any credit balances for pupils leaving us this summer will be refunded to the 'Parent Account' within ParentPay, by accessing your 'Parent Account', a withdrawal can be requested and a refund issued to the card used to make the original payment.



#### **School Lunches**

Thank you to all our parents / carers for your patience and support as we managed the temporary closure of our kitchen due to Covid 19.

As the kitchen was closed for two days this week, all pre booked lunches for this Thursday and Friday have been cancelled, along with pre-booked lunches for any children who have had to self isolate. For our Saplings and Year 3 children, any funds paid will show as a credit on the children's ParentPay lunch accounts and will be rolled over to next school year, unless a refund is requested. All school leavers, Year 4s and Saplings children moving into Reception, will receive a refund to the Parent Account within ParentPay, which then can be withdrawn, or saved for future use.

Caterlink have worked with us to organise the appropriate cleaning of the kitchen area and arranged the necessary staff cover, so that **our normal school lunch provision can resume from Monday 19th**.
