

### Update on the Fun Run sponsored event

We have managed to raise a very impressive £3,234.00 which will be so important in supporting the PTA funding programme next year. #### Arrangements regarding Covid 19 in September

The Government has issued new guidance for schools regarding the provision from the commencement of 'phase 4' of the Government roadmap. This covers the provision schools should be making in september 2021.

As you will see if you follow the link above, the vast majority of the control measures recommended will not be continued, such as the wearing of face masks, staggered pick up and drop off times, class bubbles etc.

In addition, schools will no longer be responsible for responding to cases of Covid and contacting parents, as this will now be the responsibility of NHS Test and Trace. It is stated that schools should have plans in place should further measures be needed and some control measures should remain. These come into 4 categories and are listed below:

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone.
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.

I will write to parents at the beginning of term in September, to set out our response, including addressing the four areas set out above.

### Arrangements for Pick up and Drop off in September.

As I explained above, the staggered times for pick up and drop off will not be in place in September and from the beginning of term, we will revert back to our previous established times for arrival and departure at school.

#### **Drop off**

- Children in **Y1 Y4 will enter by the main gate** (near Station Road).
- The gate will open at **8:45** and will close at **8:55** am (just as it did in the past... (if you can remember!)
- YR children will enter by the normal Pine gate into the outdoor area. The times will also be **8:45** to **8:55** am.

### Pick Up - Trialling a new one way system

- Children can be picked up between 3:30 and 3:40 pm.
- YR parents / carers can pick their children up from the Pine gate used in the morning.
- Y1-Y4 parents/carers can enter by the main gate (near Station Road). You can then walk round the school following the one way system to pick up your child(ren) from their classroom door. There will be signage to help on the 1st day!
- After picking up your child, the signs will direct you through the area, where the stage is and out through the new Y4 garden. There will be some temporary fencing, to create a safe exit, to the path near the service road pedestrian crossing.
- We are in the process of arranging to do some building work to create a permanent safe exit past the Y4 classrooms. We hope to have an update on this early next term.
