

At the Firs we are passionate about ensuring that children rapidly develop the knowledge and skills they need to become successful and confident readers.

RWI

Starting School September 2023

Parents can now make a Starting School 2023 application online via the Central Bedfordshire website at www.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/admissions or via a paper application (available on their website). Please note that your application must be made by 15th January 2023.

Leave of Absence

All educational research shows that there is a strong correlation between good attendance and good progress and so the government has made achieving good attendance a high priority for all schools.

If you need leave of absence during term time, please be aware that we are therefore unable to authorise any holidays unless deemed to be in 'exceptional circumstances'. Any holidays which amount to 5 days (10 sessions) or more will trigger a fixed penalty notice, as set out in our attendance policy, which is available to view on our website.

Illness or medical appointments

If your child will not be attending school due to illness, please leave a message on our phone or email the school office - office@firslower.org by 9.05am. This is very important as we have to account for every child and know that they are safe.

If your child has a medical appointment, please email the letter to the school or bring it to the school office where we can photocopy it. For non-urgent doctor or dentist appointments, these should be made after school.

'What are we learning?' sheets and 'Welcome' letters.

The 'what are we learning?' sheets for Years 1 - 4 will be emailed out to you today. We want to make sure that you are aware of what children are learning each term and that you have some ideas about how you can help with learning at home. We hope they are a useful starting point for discussions at home with your child about their learning.

School Service Road

In the interests of everyone's safety, only those that have been issued with a permit should use the school service road. Permits can be issued to Saplings and Kids' Club parents/carers upon request.

Please be aware that these permits allow you to park in the marked bays for 10 minutes whilst you pick up / drop off your child at The Saplings / Kids' Club. Please only park in the marked bays to avoid obstruction to school buses and other road users.

To allow a greater availability of parking for users, please do not exceed the 10 minute time limit. If you feel that you have a need to be issued with a permit for another reason, please come and talk to us at the school office.
