

#### Parent Forum

We held our first meeting of the Parent Forum on Wednesday 28th September. It was lovely to see so many of our parents at the event we focussed on the questions from the recent parent questionnaire that we held last term and invited the parents to give their views on these important aspects of our provision.

We have summarised below some of the comments made and feedback we have received:-

### The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year

Parents indicated that they found the 'what are we learning sheets' very valuable. One parent added that it's great that they get them from such a young age as young children don't tend to want to talk about what they have done during the day! One parent asked whether they could be available on Google Classroom.

# • When I have raised concerns they were dealt with properly

Parents commented that when they had raised any questions or concerns they had been dealt with promptly and the matter attended to well. Many parents also commented that it was very useful to have the teacher's email address and some new parents commented that this was not the case in their previous school. One parent said that it was very useful to have email addresses for the teachers especially if children attend Kids' Club.

#### • The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved

Praise cards and merits were discussed and there was a general feeling that these 2 systems were very useful in encouraging children to develop positive attitudes to both their behaviour and their learning. Parents also valued the use of class dojos and whether a more standardised approach the school would be worth considering. We had a very useful and positive discussion about the increased challenges the school was facing since Covid in terms of pupil behaviour and the way that the school is responding.

# The School has high expectations for my child

One new parent said that they felt that the balance between the expectation to strive for success against the need to ensure that children were happy was struck very well at this school. We talked about the fact that our approach here at The Firs was to strive to ensure that every child achieved their best but that we approached this by encouraging and inspiring children by offering them interesting and stimulating teaching.

#### My child does well at this school

It was felt that children were happy coming into school. We commented on the fact that we have had several new children this year who we have incorporated very well. Our new parents said that their children have been so happy since starting at The Firs and any issues they have had have been dealt with promptly.
