

Year 2 Harcourt Arboretum Trip

They were all given magnifying containers so that they could investigate what they had found and caught. After a jam-packed day we were all ready to get back on the coach, which took rather a long time to get us back to school, but despite this, we had a really wonderful day, and it was fantastic to see the children engaging so well with the activities provided.

Year 3 Holdenby House Trip

Year 3 had a very interesting and informative day out on the 6th July, visiting Holdenby House in Northamptonshire. The children had a glimpse into the life of a child being evacuated, enhancing their learning around World War II.





They were shown

how to make Woolton Pie, learnt about weekly rationing, helped to make a rug for the Make-Do-and-Mend Drive and then looked inside an Air Raid Shelter to learn how children in WWII kept themselves safe.

The children all looked amazing, and very much in character, in their outfits from this era. They completely embraced the roll play and activity based aspect of this unique experience, and behaved in an impeccable manner.

ParentPay - Wraparound Care and Lunch Balances

We ask that all parents check their ParentPay accounts to ensure all balances have been cleared, ie, Lunches, Wraparound Care, and Pre-School fees. Emails will be sent out as reminders to any accounts that have outstanding balances.

July's invoices for Wraparound care have already been applied to ParentPay with a due day of 1st July 2022, with fees for amendments to sessions or extra sessions requested applied daily. If you have a balance outstanding please ensure this is paid on receipt of your reminder email.

If paying by childcare vouchers, these can take up to 5 days to be received by us, please keep this in mind to allow for time for the funds to be cleared into our accounts before we break for the Summer.

Any credit balances for pupils leaving us this summer will be refunded to the 'Parent Account' within ParentPay. An email will be triggered when the refund has been processed. By accessing your 'Parent Account', a withdrawal can be requested and a refund issued to the card used to make the original payment.

Sports Days at The Firs
