# The Saplings Nappy Changing Policy



#### Statement of intent

The Saplings Pre-school recognise that there is a need for nappy changing to be safe, hygienic and a comfortable experience for both children and staff.

We see toilet training as a self-care skill that children need to develop. The nappy changing policy is in accordance with the family's requests. We work closely with parent/carers towards toilet training, unless there are medical or other developmental reasons why this may not be appropriate.

Nappy/toilet changing facilities are provided and we exercise good hygiene practices in order to accommodate children who are not yet toilet trained.

In order to encourage a healthy self-esteem and a sense of identity, practitioners should ensure that nappy changing is an enjoyable and relaxing time. It is also provides opportunities for good communication between children and staff.

### Methods

A child's nappy must be changed promptly when wet or soiled. Staff must wear disposable gloves on both hands and a disposable apron for all nappy changes. New gloves and aprons should be worn for each nappy change. Both child and staff member must wash their hands after changing a nappy.

## A child must never be left unsupervised on the changing table or changing mat

#### Procedure

- 1. Nappies must only be changed in the designated nappy changing area. Colleagues should be made aware that you are changing a child.
- 2. Ensure you have a clean nappy, wipes, nappy sacks and any other supplies before changing the child.
- 3. The door to the nappy changing room must be open at all times when changing a child.
- 4. Put a new set of gloves and a new disposable apron on.
- 5. Help the child to climb up onto the nappy changing unit.
- 6. Remove the child's nappy and seal it inside a nappy sack. Dispose of used nappies in the appropriate nappy bin.
- 7. Clean the child using wipes. Wipe the genital area from front to back.
- 8. If requested by parents/carer, apply nappy cream. The parents/carer should supply their own in a named tub. Use a clean set of gloves to apply the cream.

- 9. Put on a clean nappy. Should the child need a new set of clothes, these should be provided by the parent/carer.
- 10. Dispose of the gloves and changing apron into the bin.
- 11. Encourage the child to wash their hands thoroughly with liquid soap and running water and to then dry their hands with a disposable towel.
- 12. Put any wet/ soiled clothing into a plastic bag/nappy sack and place in child's bag.
- 13. Take the child back to the play area. Return bag to coat peg.
- 14. Prepare changing unit for next child. Thoroughly wipe down changing table and mat using anti-bacterial spray.
- 15. Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and running water. Dry your hands on a disposable paper towel and place used towel into the bin.
- 16. Write down details of the nappy change on the chart located next to the nappy changing unit.
