

We will be 'cashless' for our Book Fairs from now on! (You will need your card details with you)

We hope these notes will be helpful in ensuring book fairs go smoothly:

- Above each book shelf, you will see a 'Travelling Books' QR Code and web address. www.travellingbooks.co.uk/pay
- You can pay for the books by either scanning the QR code or visiting the web address above.
- You then need to enter the school name or postcode (MK452QR)
- Then click 'I am at the book fair and would like to pay'.
- A short form will then pop up and you will need to fill in the following details:
 - Your email address
 - Your phone number (in case there is a problem with your order)
 - Payment total (£ sign not needed)
 - Your name and address
- Tick to agree to the terms and conditions and click confirm
- It will then display an invoicing screen please then show this to one of our staff so we can visually confirm this is related accurately to the books you are taking.

We will also be working with the PTFA to hold our ever popular **Book At Bedtime** event again on the evening of the 2nd March at 5.15pm.



This is always a really popular event with children loving the chance to come back into school for a bedtime story from one of the school staff.

Accelerated Reader Trophy Competitions.

We want to encourage children to read frequently (15 minutes in school and 15 minutes at home a day) and so all the classes participate in one of our two AR Trophy competitions.

The Trophies will be awarded half-termly, to the class with the most number of words read! The first trophy will be awarded at the end of this term.

To make it as fair as possible, we will divide the total word count by the number of children on AR in the class, to find the average number of words read for that class.

Children entitled to free school meals will soon be able to book clubs during school holidays

Central Bedfordshire are partnering with e-vouchers (part of Wonde) to provide a holiday activities and food programme (HAF). The HAF programme provides fun, free activities for children and young people aged five and upwards during the Easter, summer and Christmas school holidays.

There's always a range of activities on offer, including sports and games sessions, craft and creative activities and fun days out. Healthy snacks and lunch are also provided to all children and young people attending face-to-face activities.

The sessions are inclusive, so are suitable for all children with special education needs and disabilities (SEND). The process for booking places for the HAF programme for Easter 2023 is now in place. On 6th March 2023 vouchers will be assigned to parents / carers of children eligible for free school meals, these vouchers can be used to book on to activities online.

You will need to look out for an email or text message from HolidayActivities.com. There is more information about how to book in the step by step Holiday Activity Parent Guide available for download on the Letters Home page on our website. There will be a separate voucher issued for each child with a unique code that

will need to be used to book activities. We already work with e-vouchers to distribute supermarket vouchers to eligible families during the school holidays. If you receive these, you will receive your HAF vouchers to the email address or phone number you normally receive free school meal vouchers to.

You should receive your vouchers for the Easter holidays on 6th March 2023, and you will be able to book onto activities from then onwards. If you don't receive your vouchers, or have any further questions or need further support, you can contact support@evouchers.com
