Ofsted Report

With this newsletter you will find a copy of the report following the 'Ungraded Inspection,' which took place on March 8th and 9th last term. The report is also available on our <u>website</u> and will be published on the Ofsted website in a week or so.

You will also find an accompanying letter from us about the report. I am very pleased to inform you that the key finding of the inspection is that The Firs remains in the '**Good**' Ofsted category. Strike - 2/5/23 Reminder

We would like to remind parents/carers that, as we let you know in the letter on 20th April, the National Education Union is taking industrial action on a series of days, continuing this term. The action will result in class or whole school closures across the country and teachers at The Firs will be taking industrial action again on: *Tuesday 2nd May*

I explained in my previous letters that as nearly all the teaching staff have elected to take lawful industrial action, I will have no choice but to close the school to most pupils but we will be able to remain **open partially** for the children who were eligible as 'Critical Workers' and also children who were identified as benefiting from being in school during our last strike day.

Please note, we will not be expecting any additional children to the ones who attended school on 1st February and 15th March, 2023.

As I said in my 1st letter to you on the strike action in the spring term, lost learning time is a concern and these are very difficult circumstances to manage and I would like to thank you for your continuing patience and understanding.

Year 1 Reading

Before Covid we used to regularly have parents / carers who came in to hear children read. This was very useful in giving children additional opportunities to read and was very much enjoyed by the children concerned.

Y1 teachers are looking for parent/carer volunteers to come in and hear some readers. We will need to do a DBS safeguarding check, which we will help you with. Once you can start, you will be based in a group room (such as the Owl room opposite the school office) and the children will come, one after the other to read to you.

If you think you could spare some time (preferably in an afternoon) to help us with this, please let the office or your child's class teacher know. We really would be very grateful for any time you could spare us.
