

Well done to our Year 4s! They have worked so hard this term learning their lines, songs and cues for their leavers' performances. This week they have delivered three fantastic shows, one to all the children at The Firs, and an afternoon and evening performance to parents and grandparents.

Thank you to all parents for providing so many creative outfits, and to all the staff involved in supporting the children and production, from teachers taking rehearsals and staff creating the stage and props, such a great team effort.



End of Year Achievement Data

There is less of a focus on data compared with the past. Y4 data is no longer collected by the local authority and this is the last year for statutory assessment in Y2.

We are very proud of the officially collected data however as it is an indicator of the high standards achieved by our children and so we are sharing an overview of this with you here:

a. EYFS-

- EYFS Baseline analysis arrived at the conclusion that **66.7%** were at expectations on entry in September.
- Upon final assessment in summer 23 however, **74%** achieved a Good Level of Development. (For a child to have a GLD they need to be expected in all the Prime areas as well as all the aspects of

literacy and numeracy). This is 8% above the LA average for 2022 and 2% above the last National figure we have (2019).

b. **Phonics** - Y1 Phonics and Y2 re-tests

Y1:

- We were delighted that an amazing **98%** of our Y1 pupils passed the National Phonics screening test this year!
- This is **23%** more than the 2022 National results (75%) and **16%** more than the higher pre-covid national 2019 result (82%)

Y2 Recheck:

- With all our Y2 rechecks complete, **95%** of the children in Y2 have now met the standard (compared with 87% nationally in 2022 and 91% in 2019).

School Swimming:

Sporty Scholars who provided us with the swimming pool in June completed a swimming assessment on each child in year R - year 4 their final swimming lesson. The children did fantastically well! We are pleased to share with you the following results:

76% of pupils were able to demonstrate self rescue

97% of pupils demonstrated improved water confidence

73% of pupils were able to swim more than 25 metres

A fantastic way to end the year with so much success... well done to all our young swimmers!
