2023 Phonics Test Puts Firs in top 2% of Primary Schools!

I am delighted to say that the school has received a letter from Damian Hinds MP, Minister For Schools, to congratulate The Firs on our 2023 Y1 phonics test results.

He said that at 98% meeting the expected standard, it placed us in the top 2% of primary schools in the country.

He went on to say 'Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading'.

I want to say a huge well done to all our Y2 children (who took the test last year), a thank you to all our parents for your support for your child's reading and of course, a huge thank you to Mrs Mercer for her passion for reading and all her work, leading the RWI programme and an equal thank you for all the hard work and dedication shown by of all our teachers, teaching assistants and Saplings practitioners, who start teaching sounds, beginning our children on their successful reading journey!

Helping with reading...Your School Needs You!

As shown above, we are passionate about helping our children learn to read and we realise that every moment children spend practising their reading skills is precious.

Educational research indicates that children make better progress in reading if they read daily for 30 minutes or more. In school, we provide at least 15 minutes reading time (much more in KS1, where children are developing their reading every day as part of their RWI lesson) and ask parents to encourage their child to read daily at home (and for 15 minutes in KS2).



Sickness in School

We have had quite a lot of sickness in school recently and I would like to remind you that your child will be able to come back to school following the last episode of sickness, **48 hours after this occurs.** Some parents have been sending their children back after 24 hours following their child being sick. This is too early and then infections can be passed on to other children in school. Please support us with this.

Head Lice

Head Lice are doing the rounds again. Please check your child's hair and treat it if necessary. It is so important that after the treatment, you continue to check your child's hair, applying conditioner and combing it through with a nit comb. This should be a regular routine if your child has been affected by this. We have seen how uncomfortable children are when they have recurring head lice and so we would ask you to please help us to stop this spreading throughout the school and support us with this - thank you.
