Black History Month

During October, children across the school have been taking part in activities linked with Black History Month.

Year 4



To mark black history month year 4 began the week looking at Mary Seacole. They learned how she was influential during the Crimean war caring for wounded soldiers and how she overcame racism and terrible conditions in her determination to help others.



Year 4 were also inspired by Alma Thomas an African American artist who painted in an abstract style and introduced the style 'Alma Stripes'. The children then used her style to create their own unique abstract art work.

Year 3

In Year 3 we have researched and written about famous black people who have achieved great success in their life. We made posters about those people. We have spent time saying why we are inspired by some of these people.



Year 2

To celebrate Black History Month, Year 2 learned about the lives of Rosa Parks and Nelson Mandela, and how they changed the lives of black people across the globe.

We discussed how unfair segregation was in those days, and the children were upset to learn that people weren't allowed to eat, pray or even learn together, due to the rules and regulations made by all-white governments.

We decided to try to show the children what segregation was like, and created an experiment where all children with blonde or red hair were not allowed to play for a short time during break.




The children were understandably upset by these unfairly imposed rules, and even the children with brown or black hair were upset at not being able to be with their friends. It was a small insight into how inequality has affected many people from black and mixed-race heritages for far too long.

Year 1

During history, Y1 watched a clip from cbeebies about Martin Luther King and then discussed their dreams for the future. Then they wrote down their dreams and added their handprints.

As part of our PSHRE learning the children watched another clip from cbeebies which was called Princess K's Black History Heroes. Then as part of a circle time the children spoke about who their heroes were and why, then drew a picture of their hero.

We have also been reading a variety of books in class which celebrate diversity.



Year R

In Pine we shared the book 'My First Heroes Black History'. The book teaches the children about various heroes from a black heritage such as Rosa Parks, Stormzy and Nelson Mandela. Also the children really enjoyed watching 'Princess K's Black History Heroes' on CBeebies.

Year 3 Ancient Egyptian WOW Day

On Wednesday 23rd October Y3 were visited by 'History off The Page' who led a fantastic Egyptian Day in the school hall.



Through role-play, children experienced life as it would have been in 1330 B.C. The children used authentic tools and materials whenever possible to learn skills as apprentices in a wide variety of workshops eg. lamp workers, embalmers, stone carvers, scribes, bread makers, tomb painters, amulet makers and potters.

As the day progressed, the children got involved in the issues of the time, with the chance to participate in a range of cross- curricular









activities, including preparing entertainment for the Royal Banquet celebrations. There was also a story-telling session. By the end of the day, the children had a really good idea of how it felt to be an Egyptian at this time.
